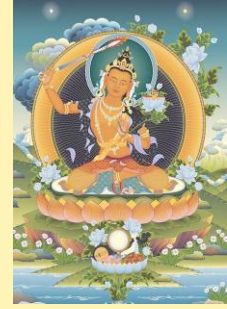

Jamyang Dagmo Sakya**, who together with her husband, His Holiness Dagchen Rinpoche, leads the Sakya Monastery of Tibetan Buddhism, www.sakya.org. Tara Ling SB meets locally, both monthly and weekly, to offer the opportunity to practice and study dharma in depth.

Lama Dagmola is one of a handful of revered Tibetan women teachers in the West, and is one of Dr. Alan Wallace's senior root lamas. We all sincerely look forward to the blessings of this visit. The Sakya lineage is particularly revered for its connection with **Manjushri, the Bodhisattva of Wisdom**. It is a special opportunity to receive this empowerment, rarely given by Lama Dagmola.

****DIRECTIONS to EMID:**

Exit off the 101 at Winchester Canyon, stay left of the gas station and take Calle Real straight ahead, which parallels the 101N. Go up several blocks and make a right onto Vereda Leyenda where you will see the adobe sign "Rancho Embarcadero." Midway up the block is #224, an historic Spanish white adobe building. There is a small adjacent parking lot to EMID, and lots of street parking on the right hand side
